NOTICE TO TENANTS PROPOSED RENT (OCCUPANCY CHARGE)

As a tenant you are hereby notified that, subject to Rural Development approval, rents will be changed effective January 1, 2026.

The Bayfield County Housing Authority has filed with Rural Development, United States Department of Agriculture, a request for approval of a change in the monthly rent (occupancy charge) rates of the Bayfield County Housing Redevelopment-RD-90, LLC, consisting of Pine Villa, Bayfield Apartments, Rittenhouse Commons, Lake View Terrace, Bay Ridge Villa I, Bay Ridge Villa II, Wilderness View, and Great Divide for the following reasons:

1. Inflation
2. Increased operation and maintenance expenses
3. Increased utility cost
4. Increased capital improvement of buildings

These comments will be reviewed by the Rural Development Servicing Official and forwarded to the Rural Development approval official who will decide if the changes should be approved.

If Rural Development approves the rent change as presented in this notice, no further notice will be made, and the new rents will become effective upon the date given above. If the approved change cannot be made effective by the date shown above, an additional 30-day notice will be posted, and the tenants will be notified in writing. The new rents will be effective at the next rent due date following the 30-day notice period.
