Renters Insurance

Many renters are under the impression that their landlord's insurance policy will cover their belongings, unfortunately that generally is not the case. Your landlord's policy covers the building itself, but it may not include your personal belongings, and may not cover injuries sustained within the structure. That's where renter's insurance comes in.

Renter's insurance protects your personal property in a rented apartment, condo or home from unexpected circumstances such as theft, a fire, or sewer backup damage – and will pay you for lost or damaged possessions. It can also help protect you from liability if someone is injured on your property.

Renters insurance is similar in scope to homeowner's insurance, with the exception that it does not provide coverage for the dwelling itself or other structures. On average, rental insurance costs \$5-17 per month depending on coverage. When shopping for renters insurance:

1. Get quotes from several different companies.
2. When comparing prices, be sure you understand the coverage each policy provides. A less expensive policy could provide less coverage.

Living without the protection of a renter's policy may become a mistake a tenant cannot afford to make.

Lawn Care

It is important to remember to keep our lawns clear of personal items and debris. This ensures that it will not be run over by the lawn mower.

- Grassy areas must be kept free of any items that will interfere with lawn care. Flowerpots, lawn ornaments, etc. must remain off mowed areas.
- Flowerpots are allowed on either porch areas or in the rock/wood chip areas outside the building.
- Tenants may NOT dig up any lawn areas or remove rock/wood chips to plant flowers, etc.

If you have questions on where you can place things, please call the office.

The Housing Authority will NOT be responsible for any damaged items that are in or near mowed areas.

Recyclables

Plastic bags **CANNOT** go in the recyclables. If you want an easy way to carry your recyclables out, collect them in a brown-paper grocery bag or some other manageable container, then empty them directly into the recyclables dumpster and reuse the bag or container.
